The Baltimore/Washington Area Welcomes American Apparel®

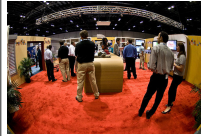

Security Specialists



The Store Detective and the Investigations Divisions are two of the most exciting divisions in Metro One. A Store Detective is described as a person who works undercover and is able to identify and detect suspicious behavior inside the retail establishment. Once the Detective has identified someone who is acting in a suspicious manner they must utilize the five steps to successfully make an apprehension. A store detective must possess the ability to blend in to any environment. They must also act professional with the management team and give advice on possible shrink areas. A store detective has an exciting job and observes all different types of theft behavior. I encourage all guards to continue to have a strong work ethic because, here in Metro One, our goal is to promote from within and develop our current, talented employees.



The Investigations Division is home to the most elite store detectives in the business with extensive experience. The Investigators usually work in teams of two or three. These Investigators are trained and qualified to make apprehensions on extreme shoplifters such as ORC members and Professionals. The Investigations Division has Captains who guide the teams into the most successful cases and a Manager to provide guidance. We are also currently looking to promote other employees to this team who have previously performed exceptionally by successfully apprehended several professional ORC members. If any account is having serious difficulty with external or internal theft, the elite Investigations Division is here to help.

Metro One Loss Prevention Services Group has added some great programs to The Home Depot lineup. Starting back in August, Metro One starting providing The Home Depot with Investigator Teams. These Teams were set up to go beyond the realm of shoplifting and go after quality cases versus quantity. The Teams are focused on the top shrink items of each particular location. The emphasis is to make an impact on target departments and flush out the root causes for the shrink of a particular item or department.

The Teams were trained specifically to work in the warehouse environment. They work in groups and travel to target locations that are preselected based on shrink, performance, and other factors. The Teams went through extensive training on the top shrink items by department class and sub class for each targeted location. The Tact Squads go after high dollar ORC cases as well and work under the direction of the Regional Asset Protection Manager as well as coordination from the Central Investigation Team.

The Teams were put together from the "best of the best" Metro One has to offer. In the first few months of operation the Teams have been successful in producing over 85 Cases and 55 Recoveries for a total dollar amount approaching \$25,000. They have had multiple cases in all of the High Shortage Items and Departments as well as a few significant incidents with Merchandise Credit/Stored Value Cards. This is just another one of the added values that Metro One Loss Prevention Services Group provides for our clients: Uniform Officers, Armed Officers, Store Detectives, Undercover Operatives, Mystery Shoppers, and Investigator Teams just to name just a few. *****
